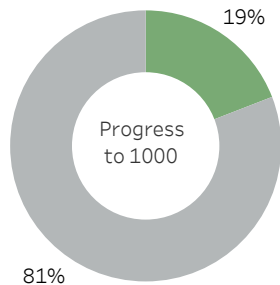
# 1000 Person Project

Count through 2/15/18

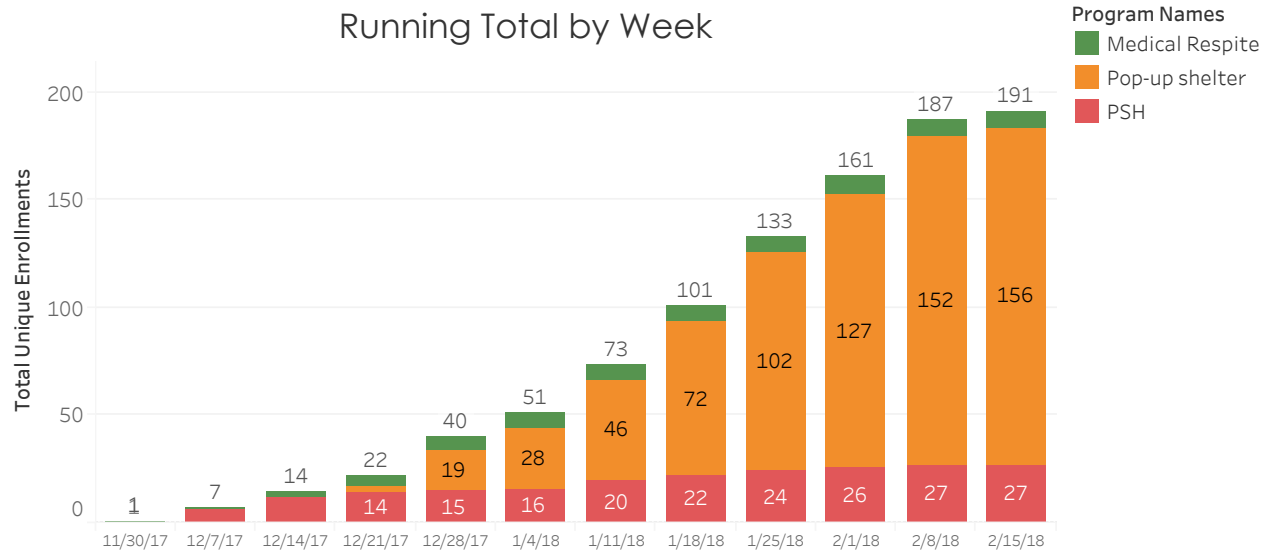


## Total Placements

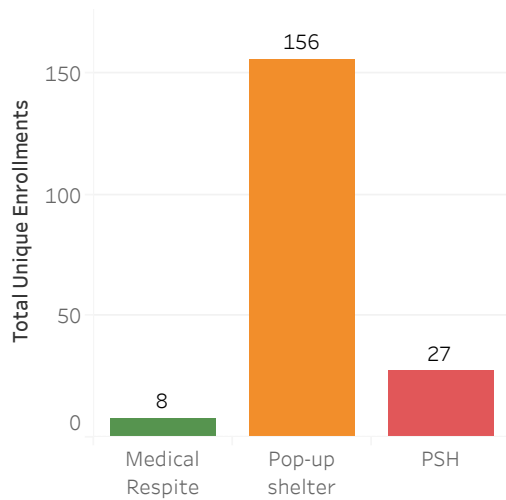

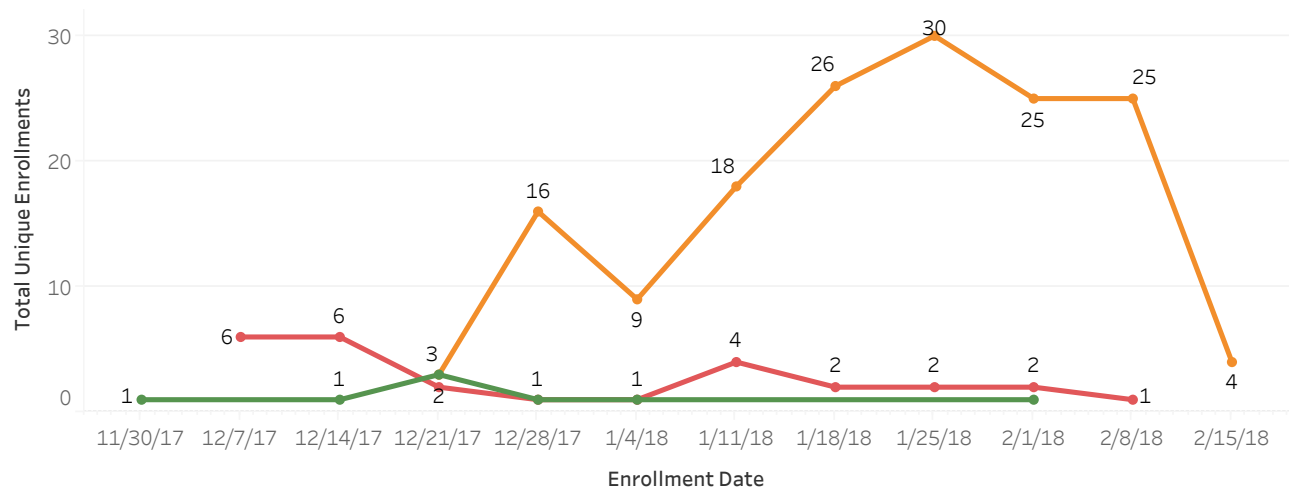
## Running Total by Week

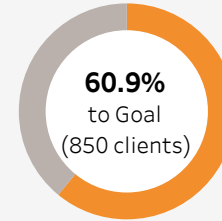

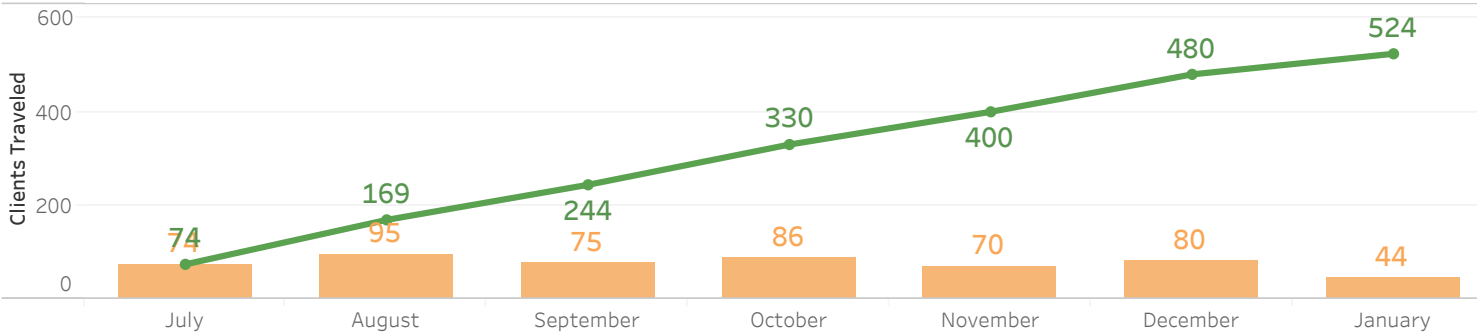

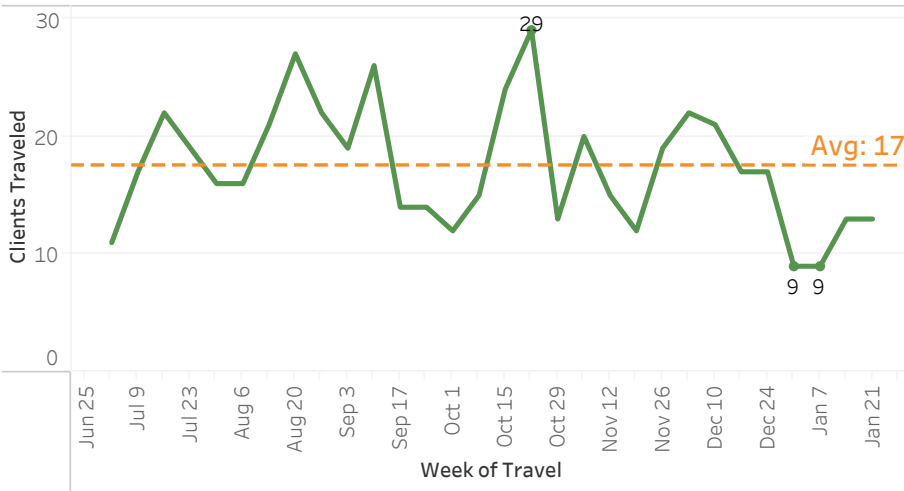

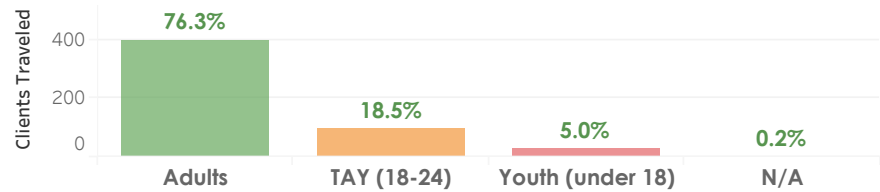
