Black people comprised $5.5 \%$ of the general population \& 40.1\% of the homeless population

## Issues of equity are critical to our work

White people constituted $48.7 \%$ of the general population, and $44.2 \%$ of the homeless population

How do we build diversity, equity and inclusion in the face of a humanitarian crisis?


## Game Changer



Will permanently house 4,000 homeless

MENTAL HEALTH AND ADDICTION SERVICES
Will serve the most severely mentally ill people on the streets. 4,500 people will receive behavioral health and substance use treatment

PREVENTION.
Will prevent homelessness for 7,000 people through rental assistance and eviction defense

## The stakes are higher with the passage of Proposition C
