






San Francisco Homeless Outreach Team: July 2019

Open 311 Shelter Waitlist Requests


*Open waitlist requests below are a point in time count captured once at the beginning of each month

Coordinated Entry

- 1,595 clients enrolled into the ONE System in August
- 143 families assessed by Access Points in August
- 655 adults assessed in August
- 78 youth assessed in August

Achieved LGBQ+ and TGNC assessment goals for Coordinated Entry for Youth blitz:

- LGBQ+ total: 141
- TGNC total: 24

Program Highlights

Division Circle Navigation Center added 60 beds

- 186 total beds
- 346 new shelter beds have been added to Mayor
 Breed's 1000 bed goal by 2020.

Inclement Weather Protocol Activated on September 25th

• SFHOT increased outreach efforts providing shelter placements, water, and other resources as available.

Upcoming Program Highlights

Larkin Street Youth Services and The SF LGBT Center collaborating to develop a peer-to-peer service model program for transgender youth experiencing homelessness including:

- problem solving
- family reunification

Salesforce and Postmates will voluntarily participate in her Proposition C Waiver legislation:

 Estimated contribution from the two companies represents \$14 million to fund programs addressing homelessness.
