



## **Proposed Acquisition of the Mission Inn for Permanent Supportive Housing Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)**

### **What is the proposed project at the Mission Inn (5630 Mission Street) and who will it serve?**

The City of San Francisco is proposing to purchase the Mission Inn at 5630 Mission Street in District 11 for use as Permanent Supportive Housing with up to 52 rooms. The building will provide affordable homes with onsite social services to help tenants gain and maintain housing and stability. The Mission Inn will have professional property management and onsite support services.

### **What is Permanent Supportive Housing?**

Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) is affordable housing with onsite supportive services. Tenants in PSH have their own units and their own leases.

### **How will the provider be selected?**

The non-profit provider will be selected through a competitive process.

### **What was the process for selecting this location?**

To assist the City and County of San Francisco in addressing homelessness, the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("HSH") issued a Request for Information (RFI) to interested property owners to submit information to assist the City in identifying suitable properties for possible acquisition as permanent supportive housing. The owners of the Mission Inn submitted property information under the RFI, and after both a document review and a site visit, the property was prioritized for acquisition based on its condition, location, price, and ability to meet the needs of people experiencing homelessness.

### **What is the process for approval and moving forward? Also, what is the timeline?**

HSH is required by Chapter 79 in the Administrative Code (Prop I) to provide 30-day notice for change of use of an existing site.

This requirement was fulfilled in August 2021 through posted signage and a notification letter sent to all residents and businesses within 200 feet of the property. Additional information about proposed projects including information about public meetings can be found at HSH's website at:

The purchase of this building must be authorized by the Board of Supervisors and will be heard in committee no earlier than September 22, 2021. ### **What is the site currently being used for? If there are existing tenants, what will happen to them?**
