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GENERAL INFORMATION ON THE 2022 COC SPECIAL (UNSHELTERED) NOFO

Overview of 2022 Special NOFO

- Application deadline: October 20, 2022
- \$322 million available nationally; uses recaptured CoC funds
- This opportunity is separate from the Annual NOFO
- NOFO includes set asides for unsheltered homelessness and for rural homelessness; San Francisco is only eligible to apply for funding through the unsheltered set aside
- Funding is for a 3-year term; funding will be renewable

CoC Roles

Collaborative Applicant: HSH serves as the collaborative applicant for the CoC, and is responsible for facilitating a local funding competition, completing an application narrative for the CoC, and submitting the CoC's consolidated application to HUD.

HSH has engaged Focus Strategies to assist with this process for the Special NOFO.

Available Funding

- CoC is eligible to apply for up to \$17,447,315 for the 3-year term
 - \$223,419 is available for CoC Planning expenses
 - \$17,223,896 is available for project applications
- Funding is renewable; mechanism through which funding will be renewed has not been announced



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ELIGIBILITY – PROJECT TYPES AND EXPENSES

Allowable Project Types

1. Permanent Supportive Housing –long-term subsidy and case management
2. Rapid Rehousing –time-limited subsidy and case management
3. Joint Transitional Housing/Rapid Rehousing –provides transitional housing (on-site) and rapid rehousing components for participants
4. Supportive Services Only –outreach or other supportive services that assist unhoused individuals (particularly unsheltered individuals) to access housing
5. HMIS
6. Coordinated Entry

Project Requirements

- Must participate in Coordinated Entry
- Must use HMIS (or a comparable data system for domestic violence survivor providers)
- Must begin operations in a timely manner and be able to document site control
- Must document a 25% match; Leasing funds do not require match
- Must not replace local or state funding

October 18, 2022	LHCB approves Project Priority List
October 20, 2022	Consolidated application submitted
