



Program Updates: Coordinated Entry



Larkin St. staff near Lake Merced.

- One year anniversary of the Multi-Disciplinary Team linking shelter guests to housing and benefits:
 - Worked at the Baldwin in February 2023 | Scheduled for 711 Post, Bayview Navigation Center, 33 Gough cabins, and Pier 94 this spring
- ► Lake Merced outreach: engaging 18 unhoused families in vehicles.
 - Mostly Housing Referral Status and monolingual Spanish speakers.
 - Housing placement fair scheduled for early April.
- → Safe Housing Community Needs Assessment report released and available on the HSH website.
 - Includes recommendations for **improvements** across the homelessness response system.



Program Updates: Coordinated Entry


→ Justice Involved Access Point launched at the county jail:


- Housing problem solving and Coordinated Entry services for unhoused people in custody.
- First three Housing Referral Status adults are in the housing placement process.

Sexual Orientation is incomplete for 7% of clients (5% Data Not Collected; 2% Refused)






Gender is incomplete for 1% of clients (1% Data Not Collected; 0% Doesn't Know / Refused)

Housed EHV Recipients




Interim Progress Report:




Housing – Placements

Program Highlights: Housing


- ► Family Housing Ladder: HSH has reviewed 89 applicant submissions to the Family Housing Ladder and will conduct a lottery to determine the 70 households placed into the program in April.
- ←Applying 50 Housing Authority vouchers at City Gardens for ongoing subsidies for the families there.

► HSH distributed guidelines outlining best practices for housing retention for tenants who are not paying their rent.



HSH Shelter Inventory

- Snapshot as of March 29, 2023.
- Public dashboard available on HSH website; refreshes daily Monday – Friday.
- Ability to filter to drill down on specific programs and populations served.



Program Updates: Shelter

►Interfaith Winter Shelter closed for this season on March 26:

• Thank you to ECS, the SF Interfaith Council, the Canon Kip Senior Center, Saint Mary's Cathedral, Saint Mark's Lutheran, and the First Unitarian Church for supporting the program.

∽Inclement weather shelters:

- Activation throughout March due to wet and cold weather.
- Information in the Department's email blasts and posted on the HSH website.

∽Hotel vouchers:

- Compass Family Services launched program for pregnant people and families (called "Urgent Accommodation Vouchers") in **early March**. Will open to referrals from access points and other entities once fully staffed.
- Young adults and survivors of domestic violence voucher programs will launch in spring 2023 with Saint Vincent De Paul as the provider.



Program Updates: Shelter

- **►**Enhanced shelter case management rollout:
 - Provider input sessions in March and April.
 - Trainings every other week for shelter case management staff to support this rollout.
- →Hosted substance use roundtable discussion with adults and young adult shelter providers on how to improve services and what kinds of support programs need to succeed.
- ► Masks will be optional for shelter guests staying at HSH-funded shelter programs as of April 3, 2023.
- ◆As Oasis acquisition negotiations continue, Providence entered into a lease so we can reopen the site as a family shelter.





Additional Updates

2022 Continuum of Care Award

- →San Francisco was awarded \$53 million, an increase of \$1.6 million from the previous year
- →All proposed projects were funded, including 38 renewal projects and 2 new projects.
- **→**Projects include:
 - 30 permanent supportive housing projects (\$42 million):
 - 28 renewal PSH projects (\$40 million)
 - Two new PSH projects (\$2 million)
 - One transitional housing project (\$445k)
 - Four rapid re-housing projects (\$6 million)
 - Three coordinated entry projects (\$2 million)
 - Two HMIS projects(\$750k)
- →Also received a \$1.25 million planning grant.



Local Updates

- ←The LHCB Policy Subcommittee will be dissolved, with majority of policy discussion moving to the Commission.
 - CoC-related policy updates will continue to be shared with the LHCB.

→ Homeless and Behavioral Health Select Committee

- Chair Hillary Ronen, Vice Chair Rafael Mandelman, and Supervisor Shamann Walton.
- Has fiscal authority to approve contracts, grants and other fiscal items related to homelessness and behavioral health.
- 2nd and 4th Fridays at 10am starting April 14, 2023.



2023 State & Federal Priorities

►HSH continues to track and advocate for state and federal legislation and budget priorities.

- **→**State legislation we're watching:
 - AB 441 (Haney): Distribute tax credit payments in advanced monthly installments
 - SB 37 (Caballero): Older Adults and Adults with Disabilities Housing Stability Act
 - SB 657 (Caballero): Homelessness Services Staff Training
- National Alliance to End Homelessness Federal Budget Asks
 - \$23.6 billion in overall funding for HUD's Homeless Assistance Grants
 - \$32.1 billion for the Tenant Based Rental Assistance account



Chief Equity Officer Update

► Equity Office, Equity in Action, and Tipping Point brainstorming a systems model for capacity building, technical assistance, and infrastructure support for existing and new CBOs.

- ►Internal equity updates:
 - HSH Equity Officer started work in March.
 - Equity Office conducted **listening sessions** to inform the upcoming Racial Equity training in May.
