7 enrolled in HDAP for SSI advocacy


14 applied for HSA benefits



10 enrolled in rapid re-housing




# **Coordinated Entry & Housing Demographics**






Race is incomplete for 5% of clients (2% Data Not Collected: 3% Doesn't Know / Refused)



Ethnicity is incomplete for 2% of clients (1% Data Not Collected; 1% Doesn't Know / Refused)













# Housing Vacancies



- 169 vacant units in lease-up phase buildings (City, National, and Diva Phase 2)) not included in inventory or vacancy percentage.
- Monthly data snapshots through July 28, 2023.






### **Housing Placement Updates**

- Strategies to reduce vacancies:
  - Updated unit refusal and participation protocol to prioritize clients who are engaged and have not recently refused.
  - Expanded role of case managers to ensure document readiness at time of referral.
  - Completion of unit-level inventory project for transparency and better workflow.
  - **Direct placement pilot** with Healthy Streets Operations Center complete:
    - 12 people moved directly from the streets into housing, evaluation of pilot underway.
- → Shelter-in-Place Hotel Program: final outcomes numbers
  - Tracked guest outcomes through the end of FY2022-23.
  - Three-quarters of guests exit to stable locations.
  - 1,835 people, including two-thirds of guests eligible for the SIP housing process, moved into housing.

- 1,049 referrals submitted
- 938 vouchers issued
- 675 households housed

### **Program Updates: Housing**

- Focus groups underway with PSH residents and providers for the PSH equity analysis.
- ►New SF Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) policy to allow PPSH residents to access rental assistance:
  - Tenants work with providers to develop a payment plan for back rent that will not overburden the household.
  - Once tenant has made three monthly payments, provider can assist with ERAP application to pay off additional back rent.
- ► Lease ups under way at City Gardens with anticipated full lease up by October 2023.

### Preliminary Data: July 5 – July 24

- Average daily unduplicated waitlist signups: 18
- 76% of waitlist signups online and 24% by phone
- Average daily shelter reservations (weekdays): 2 to 3


### Totals as of July 25:

- 250 people are on the waitlist
- 33 people have received a shelter placement.

- Snapshot as of July 28, 2023.
- <u>Public dashboard</u> available on HSH website; refreshes daily Monday – Friday.

### **Civil Grand Jury Findings & Recommendations**

→ "Hitting the Performance Bullseye: Contracting for Better Outcomes in Homelessness Services" published in June 2023.

Findings	Recommendations
<b>F1:</b> Inconsistent metrics in agreements impairs ability to evaluate programs and providers.	R1.1: HSH should develop a set of performance outcomes linked to the strategic plan that should be applied across all agreements.  R1.1 HSH Response: In progress, drawing on forthcoming Performance Measurement Plan.
HSH Response: Agree. We've been focusing on the data infrastructure to meaningfully evaluate programs. More consistent metrics is next.	R1.2: Include measures to track outcomes for all Home by the Bay subpopulations.  R1.2 HSH Response: Implemented. Data standards requirements already exist in all our agreements.



# **Civil Grand Jury Findings & Recommendations**

Findings	Recommendations
<b>F2:</b> Insufficient on-site program monitoring limits ability to evaluate providers.	R2: Standardize program and fiscal monitoring.
<b>HSH Response:</b> Partially disagree. New policies being rolled out in FY23-24 to improve monitoring.	<b>R2 HSH Response:</b> We have standardized policies developed and are implementing them with teams in FY2023-24.
<b>F3:</b> City performance scorecard does not adequately report on subpopulations in the strategic plan.	<b>R3:</b> Change the city performance scorecard to include all Home by the Bay plan subpopulations.
<b>HSH Response:</b> Wholly disagree. The City scorecard is not the place for this kind of reporting.	<b>R3 HSH Response:</b> We will develop public reporting about some of the Home by the Bay plan's subpopulations based on the forthcoming Performance Measurement Plan, but not on the performance scorecard.

- Introducing standards of care legislation in the fall.
- Four vacant seats.


### **∽** Shelter Grievance Advisory Committee:

- All meetings now in person, with next meeting on Sept. 12 from 2:00 p.m. 4:00 p.m.
- 6 vacant seats on the committee.



### **Chief Equity Officer Update**

- →HSH BIPOC-led Equity Fund application open:
  - Organizations where at least 70% of the executive leadership are BIPOC, among other criteria.
  - One-year capacity-building grants (ex. financial and technical assistance)
  - \$900,000 available; recommended request amount is between \$25,000 to \$100,000
  - More information on the HSH website.
