- Focus on **equity** and **inclusion** 2022 Urban Leaders Fellow with the State of Indiana.








Program Updates: Coordinated Entry


- ►LYRIC Youth Access Point has reopened and is now located at the HYPE Center (198 Potrero Ave.)







Program Update: Street to Home

- ► Piloted June 9 June 30, 2023.
- ► Fall 2023: full implementation stage
- On average, 1-2 weeks to:
 - Outreach an eligible person living on the streets
 - Invite them to view a unit.
 - Sign a lease.
 - Move in to a long-term home.
- Proactive, low-barrier placement model.
 - Reduced documentation burdens.

Placements as of Sept. 26

- 15 placements
- 14 remained stably housed



Program Updates: Emergency Housing Vouchers

Median days from issuance to lease-up

US: 96

SF: 57

Households w/ lease 180 days postissuance

US: 64%

SF: 77%


- ►HUD's deadline to issue turnover EHVs that have already been used was September 30, 2023
 - Voucher turnover due to eviction, death, relinquishment, and other reasons.
- Goal of over-issuance is to ensure 100% of the 906 vouchers are leased up.
 - Over 50 applications from Lake Merced outreach event.
- Post-Sept. 30, HSH staff will focus on supporting lease-ups (ex. housing location, landlord incentives)


Program Updates: Housing

- →Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) services assessment under way: focus groups completed with residents and staff in August 2023.
- ► Feedback from Mercy Housing on improved systems quality:
 - "Recently all our referrals that successfully moved in to our Casa de la Mision Senior Community has been **very smooth**.
 - Navigators also have been more than willing to stay during the interview, and assessment process to make sure new residents feel at ease when moving in.
 - In addition, it appears that the screening process has improved as new residents have demonstrated independence.
 - These positive changes from the screening process to actually moving in have not only helped residents settling in to a new environment but also allowed Mercy Housing staff to provide the best possible services to meet resident's needs."






Housing Vacancies

Program Updates: Shelter

∽Hotel vouchers:

- Program for survivors of domestic violence will launch in October – provider is St. Vincent de Paul.
- → Journey Home shelter placements began on Sept 25:
 - 1- to 3-day placements for people leaving San Francisco through DMACC program to prepare for trips home.
- **→Hospitality House** expanded to 24/7 as of Sept. 1.

Adult Shelter Reservation Waitlist

Preliminary Data: Sept. 1 - 18

- Average daily waitlist signups: 14
- 75% of waitlist signups online and
 25% by phone
- Average daily shelter reservations (weekdays): 2

As of Sept. 26:

• 377 people are on the waitlist (decrease of 70 since last month)



Program Updates: Shelter

- → Placements to City Gardens family PSH:
 - Family shelter staff supporting referred guests with document readiness, unit viewings, and move-in appointments.

∽Shelter reinflation:

- Returning congregate shelter capacity at four sites to full capacity to prepare for additional placements this winter.
- Total gain of 338 beds.

Program Updates: Lake Merced



Larkin St. staff near Lake Merced at an outreach event in spring 2023.

- ► SFMTA approved parking changes that may impact 100+ households living in vehicles on Winston Drive (near Lake Merced).
 - Delayed implementation by 3 months to ensure more time for HSH placements
- → Since spring 2023 HSH has been conducting intensive outreach, including housing and resource fairs.
- Outreached to 100% of occupied vehicles and actively engaging with 70 households in the area.
 - 20 EHV applications submitted (10 adults, 10 families)
 - ~70 Coordinated Entry assessments
 - HOT helped repair 6 vehicles, working on 2 additional vehicles.




2023 Continuum of Care Competition

- Annual application for HUD federal funding:
 - 2022 competition: \$53,021,237 for 38 renewal and 2 new projects
- → HSH application approved by Local Homeless Coordinating Board on Sept. 11.
 - Authorization from the Board of Supervisors to apply for these funds on Sept. 26.
- Application submitted on September 28:
 - Grants to 22 providers with a focus on housing.
 - \$51.8 mil. in annual renewal funds for projects already funded thru. CoC.
 - \$5.5 mil. in bonus funds for 5 proposed projects
 - \$1.5 mil. in planning

Updates from other Advisory Bodies

→Local Homeless Coordinating Board:

- Four open seats on LHCB.
- 2023 HUD Continuum of Care Application submitted on Sept. 28, 2023

∽Shelter Monitoring Committee:

Four vacant seats – recruitment is active.

→ Shelter Grievance Advisory Committee:

- All meetings now in person, with next meeting on Dec. 12 from 2:00 p.m. 4:00 p.m.
- 6 vacant seats on the committee of 15 total.



Equity Office Updates

- Third series of HSH's racial equity staff training ongoing in September and October 2023.
 - Work to include equity-building trainings in onboarding to catch new staff up.
- Leading HSH's work on the **Ending Trans Homelessness** initiative:
 - Helping with program design and gathering community input for the new permanent supportive housing site for TGNCI+ young adults
 - Planning trainings for providers about serving TGNCI+ clients: "Affirming Trans Access to Housing."
