




Coordinated Entry & Housing Demographics

Program Updates: Coordinated Entry

- →Opening 140 adult rapid re-housing opportunities in February 2024.
 - Referrals through Coordinated Entry in partnership with the Multi-Disciplinary Team, SFHOT, and Behavioral Health Services.
- ►Multi-Disciplinary Team tentative schedule at non- and semicongregate sites in winter/spring 2024:
 - February: Adante
 - March: Cova
 - April: 685 Ellis

Relocation Assistance

Since 2005, San Francisco has helped **over 11,000 households** experiencing or at risk of homelessness reunite with support networks and stable homes outside the City.

Three City programs under HSH & HSA offer travel assistance:

HSH: Problem Solving - Relocation Assistance

Who: People experiencing homelessness.

What: Coordination with support network + flexible assistance for moving into new community.

Where: Access points, family shelter, community locations.

7/23 - 12/23: 114 households served.

HSA: Homeward Bound

Who: County Adult Assistance Program clients.

What: Coordination with support network – expands on HSH's relocation services.

Where: CAAP office @ 1235 Mission Street

7/23 - 12/23: 10 households served.

HSA & HSH: Journey Home

Who: People experiencing homelessness and/or with a substance use disorder.


What: Safety assessment, temporary shelter. Lowest-barrier approach to quickly help people relocate.


Where: Referrals from partners, or self-referrals – call (669) 265-9373.

Housing Inventory Dashboard





Housing Placements

Emergency Housing Voucher (EHV) update:

903 households housed as of Jan. 26, 2024.

Housing: New Programs

~180 Jones opening:

- New building from the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) construction pipeline will begin move ins in February.
- 50% of units (35 studios) for chronically homeless adults.
- Partial Funding: 2022 Continuum of Care bonus project award.

∽Sober Living Permanent Supportive Housing:

- Diversifying housing options to support sobriety and treatment as part of a Housing First approach.
 - "Opt-in" housing for tenants of supportive housing or coming out of transitional housing.
- Supportive services and operations: Tenderloin Housing Clinic
- 150 units of Permanent Supportive Housing at 950 Kearny Street for adults.
- Commission: March 7, 2024



Housing: Program Update

→Procurements update:

- Providers for the Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool for women and shallow subsidies programs will be announced in February.
- Proposals for Request for Qualifications (RFQ) #114 for supportive services at 1174 Folsom due on 2/27.
- **←**Continuum of Care award: \$53,794,910
 - All 39 renewal projects funded (\$51.98 million)
 - Includes: 29 permanent supportive housing sites, 4 rapid re-housing programs. 1 transitional housing program
 - 1 new permanent supportive housing project funded **4200 Geary** (new construction)



Lake Merced: Outreach and Housing Placements Update

 Working with SFMTA (including monthly meetings) to coordinate outreach before enforcement of new parking restrictions, including near Lake Merced.

Offline Vacancies


- ►Standard for some units to be offline for turnover or needed repairs.
- **~ 2.5% offline vacancy** rate is "healthy" in our systems.

HSH Shelter Inventory

- Snapshot as of January 31, 2024.
- <u>Public dashboard</u> available on HSH website; <u>refreshes daily Monday</u> – <u>Friday.</u>
- Ability to filter to drill down on specific programs and populations served.



Program Updates: Shelter

- Increase in family shelter occupancy rates after implementing same-day referrals and placements
 - As of 1/30, family occupancy was at 96% and had been over 95% for a week
- Preparing to open the Mission Cabins program in March 2024:
 - 60 cabins with 68 beds.
 - Showers and restrooms, meals, case management, supportive services.
 - Five Keys is the provider.
- Pier 94 program:
 - Last guest left the site on Jan. 29.
 - Outcomes for the 114 guests in the program as of April 2023 on this slide.

Pier 94: Guest Outcomes

72% to permanent housing

12% abandoned placement

8% to other shelter

4% reunified with family

4% other



Shelter: Denials of Service (DOS)

- Immediate DOS: household can seek shelter again through HSH's normal channels (only valid at program where it was issued).
- Non-immediate DOS: households can stay in the program if they appeal through Shelter Grievance.

Legislative Update

Upcoming Local Legislation

- Streamlined contracting ordinance continued to February
- New lease for continued use of Bayshore
 Navigation Center at 125 Bayshore Boulevard
- Accept and Expend for Round 3 Homekey Award for 685 Ellis Street.
- Six-month continuance of behested payments waiver (expires April 2024)
- Multiple grant agreement amendments going through the Commission and the Board by end of FY 2023-24.

State Legislation

Feb. 16: Deadline to introduce bills.

Proposed State Budget Update

- Governor's proposed \$291.5 billion budget released in January.
- ►No significant cuts to homelessness and behavioral health; significant cuts to affordable housing.
- → Defers all new discretionary spending discussions to this spring for discussion with the Legislature, based on actual revenues
- →Addressing the homelessness crisis remains a **top priority** of the Administration despite **challenging budget year.**



Proposed State Budget Highlights

→ Homeless Housing, Assistance, and Prevention Program:

- Maintains a total of \$1.1 billion General Fund for HHAP 5 across 2023-25.
- Delay from 2023-24 to 2025-26 of \$260 million General Fund HHAP funding.
- Top priority for HSH and SF to ensure it is in the final budget

~CalAIM Implementation:

- Maintains approximately \$2.4 billion (\$811.1 million General Fund) in 2024-25 to continue the state's transformational CalAIM Initiative.
- Maintains \$24.7 million in 2025-26 for six months of rent or temporary housing as a county opt-in benefit.

- Five vacant seats.
- Final 2023 Continuum of Care awards list posted in late January.



2024 Pointin-Time Count

Unsheltered count conducted on January 30, 2024.



January: PIT Count

Street count of unsheltered homelessness is scheduled for **Jan. 30.**

Data compiled in subsequent weeks for sheltered count and HIC as of the night of Jan. 30. PIT Survey administered in Feb. 2024.

May: Initial Release

Summary data is reported to HUD; submission deadline TBD.

Key findings are released to media following the HUD submission.

July: Full Report

Full PIT Report, Youth Count Report, and Executive Summaries are published to HSH website.

Includes supplemental data not reportable to HUD and survey findings.



Equity Office Updates

- **← Ending Trans Homelessness initiative:**
 - Affirming Trans Access to Housing training for HSH providers extended with monthly sessions through June 2024.
 - Community engagement sessions for provider feedback on better providing transaffirming care.
- **→**3 HSH staff have started the **Trauma-informed Systems 2024** cohort:
 - Trauma-informed lens for racial equity work.
 - Develop internal training on these topic areas.
- **→BIPOC Equity Fund contracts** in the final phase of execution.
