

9 outreach workers



# **Program Updates: Coordinated Entry**

- Coordinated Entry Redesign Implementation Committee nominated two new co-chairs:
  - Denise Riggins (DISH) and Michael Henry (Catholic Charities)
  - Leading implementation of the redesign recommendations and strengthening community engagement.
- Project Homeless Connect event on March 20:
  - HSH and CE providers served **179** households.
  - First PHC event with housing navigation services for households prioritized for permanent supportive housing (in addition to Coordinated Entry assessments for new clients).




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



### **Housing Inventory Dashboard**




33% (431) of referrals went to people staying in District 10.
34% (334) of move-ins were people staying in District 10 upon referral.



# **Housing: Program Updates**

### Housing Quality Standards (HQS) inspections:

- Policy will be issued in early April about housing inspections of locally funded units.
- Part of HSH strategy to **ensure housing quality** across the portfolio (federally funded units already receive these inspections).
- HSH is:
  - **Distributing a brochure** to tenants about what to expect.
  - Updating program participant rules outlining rental subsidy eligibility and compliance.


#### • Permanent supportive housing enhanced services agreement:

- Pilot for onsite services for people with complex medical and behavioral health needs for 40-60 tenants at the Kelly Cullen Community PSH site.
- Addresses need for enhanced services for PSH residents with acute health needs.
- Agreement with Cardea Health before the Homelessness Oversight Commission today and slated to start in spring 2024.



# **Full Launch of Unit Level Inventory**

- Unit level inventory (ULI) fully functional in the Online Navigation and Entry System for all site-based permanent supportive housing.
- Infrastructure change for more accurate tracking of inventory, referrals, enrollments, occupancy, unit characteristics, funding sources, eligibility, and vacancies in a single system.
- •Vacancy reporting not available this month during the transition.





### **High Vacancy Properties: Update and Next Steps**

- High vacancy building: more than 10% of units are vacant, with at least 10 vacant units.
- •At the beginning of 2024, high vacancy buildings accounted for **41%** of total vacancies.
- •Currently, high vacancy buildings comprise **35%** of total vacancies
- By July 1, we expect to have fewer than 10 high vacancy properties, and for them to comprise less than 25% of total vacancies
  - Continue using targeted strategies for high vacancy properties
  - Employ an **early warning indicator system** to identify properties that are at risk of becoming high vacancy and continue to reduce the list




### Lake Merced: Outreach and Housing Placements Update






### **Shelter Reservation Waitlist System Improvements**

# **Legislative Update**

- Grant agreement amendments in Board process:
  - Three amendments heard by HOC on 3/21 going through Board process with hearings in April.
  - Four amendments heard by HOC in April going through Board process this spring
- ➡Behested payments waiver passed Government Audit and Oversight on 3/21 and full Board on 3/26.
- Ordinance requiring a permanent Homeward Bound relocation assistance program administered by HSH and HSA passed the full Board on second reading on 3/26.
- Hearings: A Place for All and neighborhood impacts of PSH on 3/28; street response teams on 3/21

State Update

Letter of support for SB 37 (subsidies for older adults and people with disabilities) issued.



# **Updates from other Advisory Bodies**

#### **•**Local Homeless Coordinating Board:

- Four vacant seats.
- Finalizing bylaws and voting on committee chairs.

### **•**Shelter Monitoring Committee:

• One vacant seat.

### **•**Shelter Grievance Advisory Committee:

- Three vacant seats.
  - Two "at large" seats dissolved in accordance with the administrative code.
  - Seat 7 (adult providers) filled by Pastor Yul Dorn
- Next meeting on April 9, 2024 from 2:30 4:30PM in City Hall Room #305 (hybrid)



# **Equity Office Updates**

### •Affirming Trans Access to Housing training:

- Training for providers extended with monthly sessions through June 2024.
- Three additional sessions for HSH staff added.
- Community listening sessions for feedback on the training underway.
- Racial equity training modules #1 #3 now on SF Learning online portal.
  - 82% of staff have completed all modules with 86 staff using the online portal.
  - Training #4 under development.





- HSH's open positions are listed on the <u>citywide DHR website</u>.
- HSH strategy for filling key vacant positions.
