


Coordinated Entry: Demographics



Program Updates: Coordinated Entry


- ► Local Homeless Coordinating Board Coordinated Entry committee meeting second Tuesday of the month.
- ► Established the Coordinated Entry Implementation Group and its subcommittee. The work to date includes:
 - New Coordinated Entry Governance Charter approved in January 2024
 - New Coordinated Entry Mission and Values statements to be presented at the Local Homeless Coordinating Board public meeting in May
 - **Upcoming milestone**: Exploring and identifying changes to Coordinated Entry prioritization






Relocation Assistance


San Francisco offers three programs that help people experiencing or at risk of homelessness reunite with support networks and stable homes outside the city.


- Problem Solving Relocation Assistance: Offered by the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing for unhoused clients.
 - This program started in July 2022 as the successor to the longstanding Homeward Bound program.
- County Adult Assistance Program (CAAP) Relocation
 Assistance: Offered by the <u>Human Services Agency</u> for CAAP recipients.
 - This program started in April 2023.
- Journey Home: Offered by HSA and HSH as part of the Drug Market Agency Coordination Center (DMACC) for unhoused people and people with substance use disorders.
 - This program started in September 2023.



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Housing Program Updates

Scattered Site Housing:

- Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool agreements have been executed and referrals to Community
 Forward SF and TGI Justice Project are set to begin in May 2024.
- ► HSH has made tentative awards in the **Shallow Subsidy Housing Program** for adults and families:
 - Abode Services selected for the adult program
 - Mission Neighborhood Center selected family program
- Flexible Housing Subsidy Pool for Women:
 - Community Forward SF was selected to administer this program

Housing Quality Inspections:

- Housing Quality Inspection policy issued in April
 - Designed to ensure housing quality across the project-based housing portfolio
 - HSH is currently educating tenants about the policy
 - HSH is developing a Housing Quality Inspection policy and procedure for scattered site housing



Hope House Update

84 clients enrolled in this program when we began the winddown

68 tenants have been rehoused including:

- 29 in Permanent Supportive Housing
- 29 in Rapid Rehousing
- 1 in veterans housing
- 1 in family housing
- 4 moved into stable housing outside of the homelessness response system
- 2 housed with problem solving assistance
- 2 other

There are currently 16 households still in the housing placement process.

34% (341) of **move-ins** were people staying in District 10 upon referral.



- Ability to filter to drill down on specific programs and populations served.




Lake Merced: Outreach and Housing Placements Update

Working with SFMTA to coordinate outreach before enforcement of new parking restrictions, including near Lake Merced.



Program Updates: Shelter & Outreach



- Mission Cabins opened on April 15th
 - Placement priority: People experiencing homelessness in the Mission District.
 - Making 5 placements daily until fully occupied.
 - Operator: 5 Keys



Additional Updates

Legislative Update

- 9 pieces of legislation for grant agreements in Board process:
 - 6 amendments heard by HOC in March and April have anticipated hearings in May
 - 2 amendments and 1 new agreement heard by HOC in May have anticipated hearings in May and June.
- Hearings in April:
 - Homelessness and Supportive Housing Pre-Budget Hearing
 - Delays on Elevator Modernization NOFA
 - Family Homelessness Response System
- Upcoming legislation this summer:
 - Authorization to enter into a Grant Agreement with the San Francisco Health Plan for HHIP funding.
 - Accept and Expend for 685 Ellis Round 3 Homekey Award

- Current focus of the Committee: shelter staff training, ensuring shelters respond to complaints, and shelter video systems.

∽ Shelter Grievance Advisory Committee:

- 3 vacancies
- Next meeting on Tuesday, June 18th, 2024 from 2:30 4:30PM



Equity Office Updates

Strategic Planning

- Equity framework for Home By The Bay
 - Building the roadmap to equity fundamentals and dynamics into all activities and goals of the Home by the Bay plan.

Training

- ► Racial Equity Training 1, 2 & 3 digitally available in SF Learning
 - 86.5% of HSH staff have completed all three modules
- Affirming Trans Access to Housing
 - 252 attendees across 5 trainings with CBOs. 2 more to go.
 - 633 expected to attend the training in total
