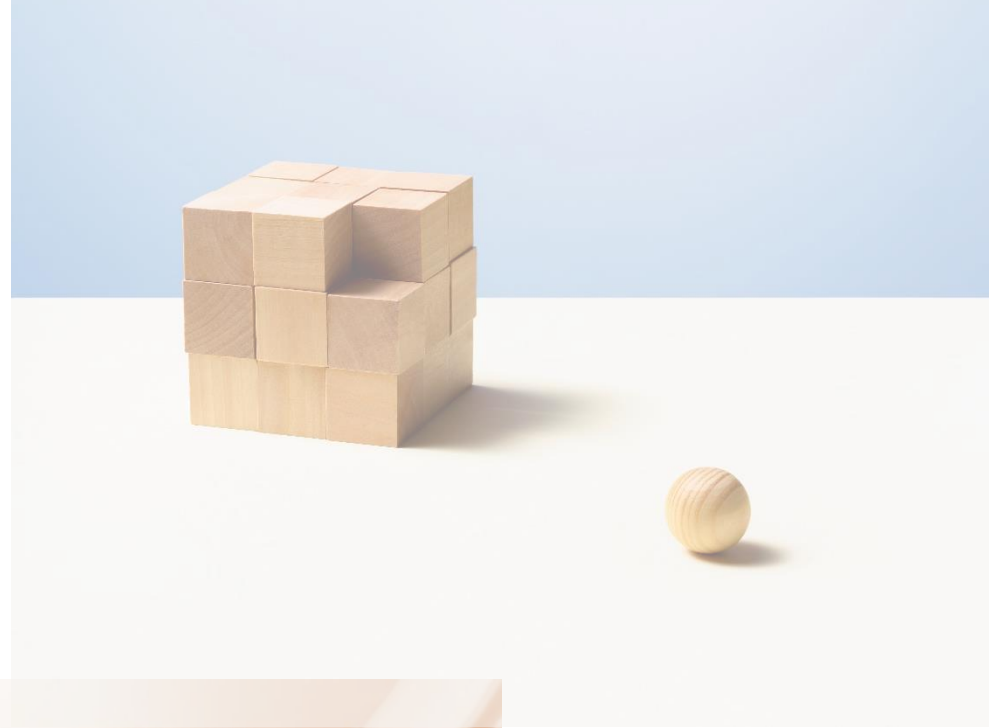

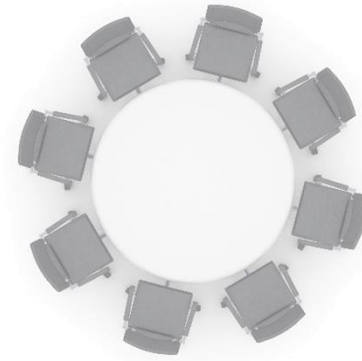

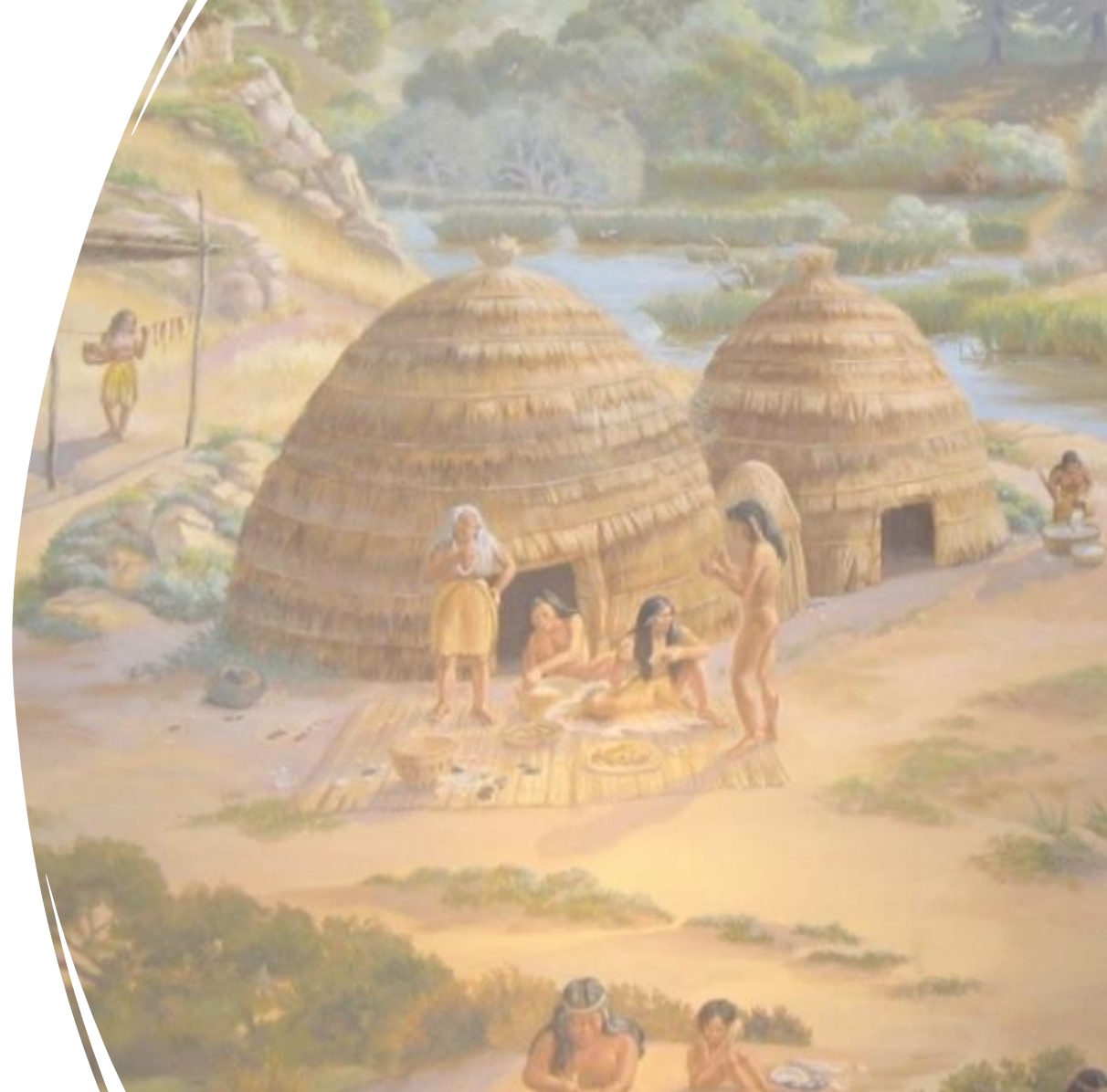
Land Acknowledgement

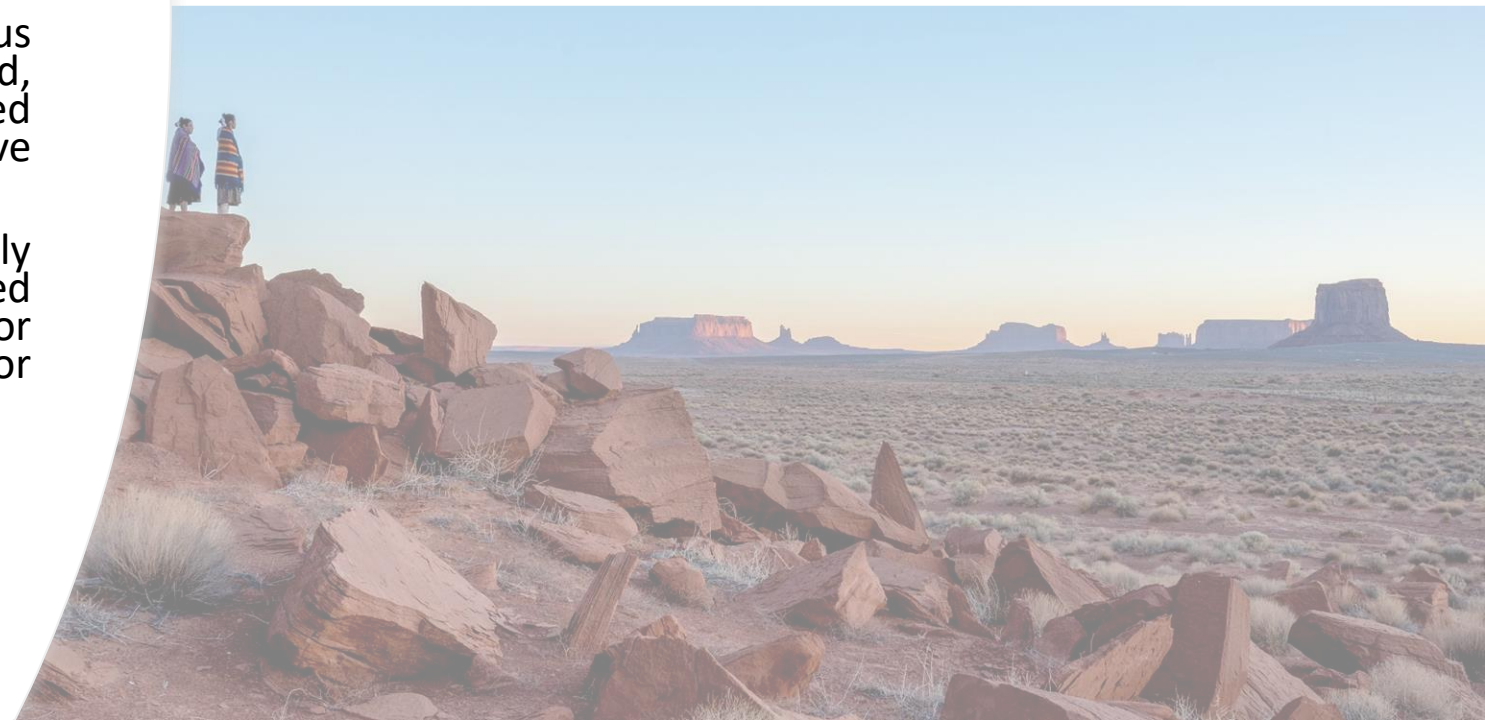
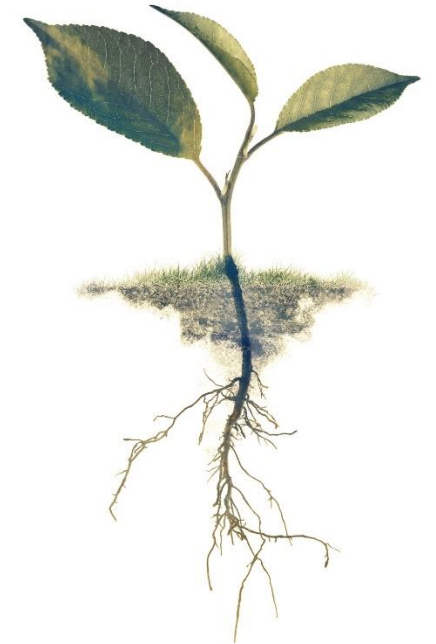
Labor Acknowledgement

Subcommittee Report-Outs


1. Governance and Oversight
