Create Shared Foundation

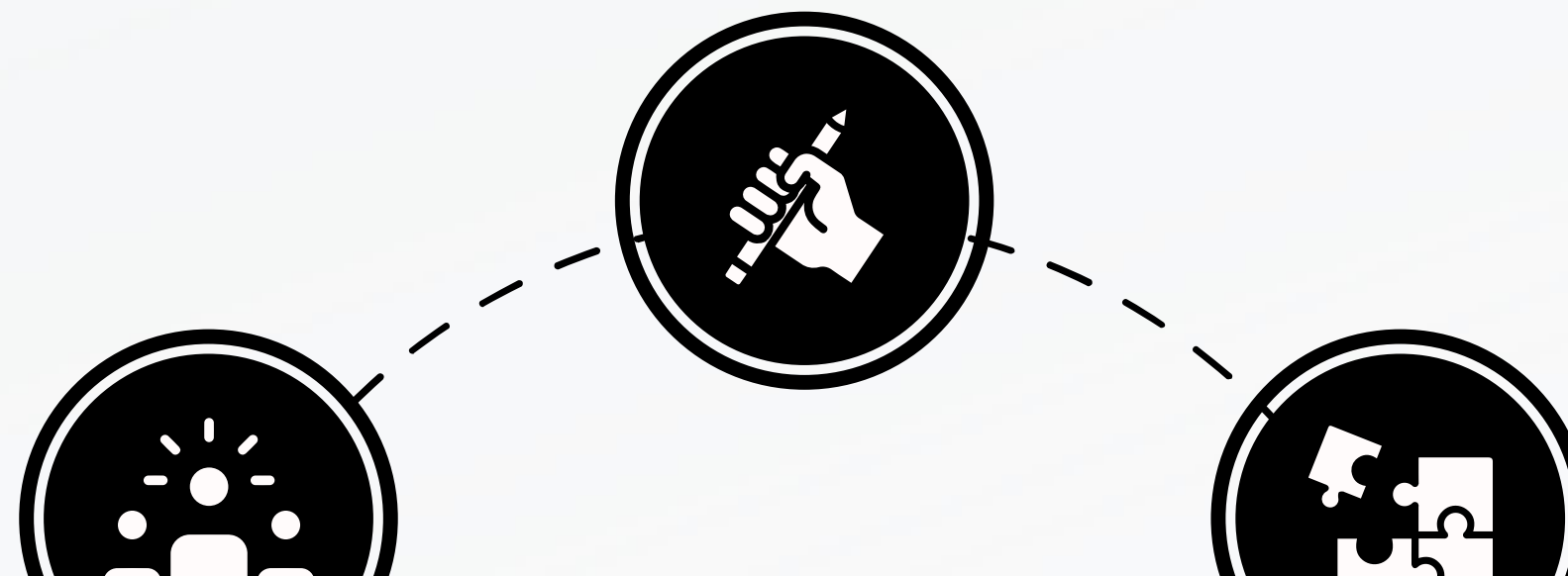
To establish a shared foundation for our work and guide all of the decisions that this Committee makes

Follow Through on CE Recommendations

CE Recommendation: “In collaboration with key partners, establish a clear and unified vision, mission, values, and explanations so that everyone understands what CE is and how to use it as the entry point to housing resources.

Guide Work of the CE System

Create a framework so that people understand what CE is and isn't. Guide how people who work in CE (e.g., providers, HSH) should approach the work

VISION

We believe that housing is a human right. We envision a San Francisco where everyone has a safe, stable home that meets them where they are and gives them what they need. We believe that all people deserve housing, shelter, and safe spaces, and that San Francisco's work is not finished until this goal is achieved. We envision a system that sees and centers the whole person/family and that recognizes and combats historical oppression. We are committed to ensuring that everyone has the housing, supports, community, and opportunities they need to thrive.

We envision a Coordinated Entry system that is helpful, healing, and equitable for both people experiencing homelessness and those providing services. We strive to create a community-centered system that connects people to the homelessness response system, understands people, and identifies and matches resources to meet their needs.

We recognize that Coordinated Entry (CE) is a process and entry point to the homelessness response system, but it is not the end point. While we will intentionally use the resources we have to serve those experiencing homelessness, we know that we need more than San Francisco currently has to offer. The CE system is an integral part to reaching our vision, and we will continue to use our resources in ways that help us move closer towards this goal.

People who have experienced homelessness are powerful and resilient. Their participation at all levels and in the decision-making process make Coordinated Entry better

MISSION

How Will We Achieve our Vision?



- Decrease disproportionality
- Equitably distribute and maximize resources
- Center and lead by people experiencing homelessness
- Collaborate within and outside of San Francisco and engage diverse partners

- Be transparent and regularly communicate
- Build organizational capacity
- Do whatever we can to give people what they need, when they need it
- Be responsive to people's stories and situations
- Focus on wellness of the system and care for those providing CE services

- Continuous learning, evaluation, and improvement
- Empowerment; leadership and guidance from people with lived experience
